


## NATIONAL SUCCESS AT THE INDOOR **CHAMPIONSHIPS!**





#### Gold for Lewes AC pole vaulters at National Indoor Championships!

Two golds medals topped off another outstanding England Indoor Age Group (U15/U17/U20) Championships for Lewes AC's pole vaulters! The club sent 15 vaulters up to Sheffield to compete at the UK's top indoor track and field event at the beginning of February. Ava Hayes (Girls U17) and Bill Scott (Boys U15) performed spectacularly to win gold for Lewes AC! Our congratulations also go to Sylvie Ward, Imogen Clarke, Ivan Wray, Remy Louis and Luca Mindel for a top five finish in their age groups. These remarkable achievements – by far the best of any club in the country – are only made possible by the support of Lewes AC and a fabulous group of parents and coaches, led by Rick Pilling and Alan Easey.

#### More gold medals for Lewes AC athletes!

Twenty athletes competed at the Sussex AA Indoor Championships over a beautiful spring weekend at the start of March, with some amazing results...



The Lewes pole vaulters again dominated the competition and the medals with an astonishing 4 gold medals going to Luca Mindel (U15B), Ava Hayes (U17W), Ivan Wray (U17M) and Imogen Clarke (U20W). A huge well done to all but a special mention to Luca who also broke the country record with a clearance of 3.40m!

Silver medals were also awarded to Sylvie Ward (U15G), Bill Scott (U15B) and Beth Boyes (U17W), whilst our bronze medallists included Iris Hitchmough (U15G) and Remy Louis (U15B).

A standout performance from Emilia Singer saw her crowned county champion in the U17W long jump, as well as placing 2nd in the triple jump, 2nd in the 60m hurdles, and 4th in the 60m sprint! Isacc Onwe also won a great silver in the U17M triple jump with a new PB.

Our sprinters also had a great weekend, with another fine performance from Oscar Fermor-McGhie winning gold again in the U15B 60m hurdles, whilst Romy Holdsworth-O'Donnell



placed 4th in the U17W 60m hurdles. Molly Jones and Grace Moriarty reached the U15G 60m final and placed 4th and 5th respectively. A big well done to everyone who competed and all those who achieved a new PB!








# Becoming a Coach by Karin Divall

2022......We were coming out of lockdown and I was looking for a new challenge...woah did I find one!

Something practical and outside I thought as the sun blazed down - never dreaming of endless bitterly cold nights, pouring rain, frosty tracks - and going through countless pairs of gloves that even worn in double and triple layers were never warm enough.





to get involved with. How hard could it be! I mentioned my interest to Peter Masters- and he responded immediately with an effusive yes! I have to add that I had never picked up a shot or a javelin, jumped over a hurdle or tried a long jump. I hadn't a clue what I was doing but I was met with an enthusiastic welcome and the best group of young Assistant Coaches who were so helpful, knowledgeable, and who taught me so much about athletics.

So we broke for the summer and then I returned in September to find I was the only qualified Coach in the Academy (I should add my background is endurance coaching) so suddenly I was organising the sessions, organising the assistant coaches, over-seeing the sessions - it was a baptism of fire. I must also apologise to the assistant coaches for all my bonkers ideas and trying out endless new things - they were very patient. Luckily Peter Selby the Race Walking Coach recognised my horror and valiantly joined me in overseeing the Academy. I quickly got onto an Assistant Coach Course, followed by an Athletics Coach course - all funded by the club. I also did my level 1 field official course so that I could learn about the rules of field events.

The focus of the Academy is to develop rounded athletes who can run, jump, throw-however a couple of young athletes had said to me they loved running so much, they wanted to do more. So I spoke to Dave Leach who coaches the junior endurance squad, and he said I could feed athletes from the Academy into his junior endurance running group, on the condition that I helped him with the Coaching! So here I am coaching the endurance juniors squad 3 times each week! It's been an amazing opportunity to coach alongside and learn loads from our leading endurance coach. I've also been supported by the club to achieve my Event Coaching (Endurance) qualification.

As part of my development I also help Trev Simcox who is the Sussex Hurdles Coach, and who has an amazing ability to provide bespoke training for every athlete - this has enabled me to learn loads about technique - but also about "how to coach". I sometimes help Julia Bennet at Withdean who expertly coaches the junior combined event; combined events coaching is something I'd like to develop in Lewes AC in the future. And when our throws coach Mike Bale had to take some time out of coaching I felt confident enough to offer to help his specialist group - I won't know anything like as much as he does, but I have learnt that Coaching isn't about having all the answers.

I have had days where I have found Coaching really tough, sometimes overwhelming, particularly when I have been left alone with a large group, had to oversee a group without knowing what I was doing, or had to think on my feet in an unexpected situation. But it is also rewarding- the juniors are so funny, they are very sociable and chatty, they are dedicated to their sport, they work so hard and I am so proud of their achievements; whether its seeing children become athletes, the first time they compete, their first medal, getting selected for Sussex....hopefully I have made a small contribution to their success. I also have great support from parents who have told me how much they appreciate what I am doing, and how important the structure of training is for their children.

The one theme that runs through my experience, is that there just aren't enough athletic coaches in the club, hence I have often felt out of my depth, or on my own. It also means that if you do offer to help a Coach with their group you will be snapped up immediately! I have renewed respect for our coaches who are out in all weathers several times a week, and usually on their own because there just aren't the number of coaches we need.

Yes it does take time to develop as a Coach and I reckon it is only now after nearly 3 years, lots of practice, lots of learning that I feel I am starting to believe that I am a "Coach", but I also know I will keep learning until I hang up my stopwatch and whistle. It's a commitment in terms of initial training, but also you need to be regularly coaching to get to know your athletes properly, and to give them stability of training, and to develop your coaching skills. So you need zero experience, enthusiasm to learn, time to achieve your qualification, to be committed to coach for at least two hours once a week, and good thermal clothing. In return the club will fund your training and you will be richly rewarded by your athlete's commitment and progress.


